The new year also begins a new cycle of blooms from my old dependable plants that bloom at the same time every year. My Phalaenopsis are almost all in spike, and my Angraecum "Crestwood", a Madagascar native, is in full bloom. Also known as the Star of Bethlehem, it has an interesting story due to its greenish tubular spur that can reach nearly 12 inches. Darwin predicted in 1862 that the plant's unknown pollinator would be a moth with a proboscis long enough to reach the nectar at the bottom of the spur. It was not until 1921 that the moth was discovered, long after Darwin had died. Mine is a small plant and would probably like a new home, but it is an interesting plant for any

collection and seems to survive in local conditions.

Our May show is quickly approaching and we should all be thinking about how we can help. We will need lots of volunteers and lots of beautiful orchids for a successful show. Our February



speaker, Dr. Arthur Katz, is giving a presentation on creating the perfect orchid display. Whether you plan to bring plants for judging, helping with our society's display, or planning on creating a beautiful niche, you should come enjoy and learn from Dr. Katz.
