Not so easy are my large Dendrobiums, but this year I have a folding cart that Laura correctly insisted that I buy, and it works very well. Moving them into the garage by "cart" was much easier. We just had three cold nights below 50 degrees. That is usually my guide to protecting my orchids. After it was over, the actual temperatures at my house were 48-49 degrees for only a couple of hours before each dawn. The plants probably would have been just fine without the trip to the garage, but the weather forecast was for colder nights. Vandas are more sensitive to the cold and will start dropping leaves if subjected to any cold temperatures. They don't die but the plants do become less attractive. I have many people tell me they don't do anything special to protect their orchids, but I think that is the exception rather than the rule on Merritt Island.

We have our annual Christmas Party coming up and we are looking forward to a good time and lots of good food. Everyone thought my ugly sweater was "too cute" last year, so I'm trying again this year with something different. Please sign up and join us for a fun and an enjoyable evening.
