Many of you have been over to pick up one of Charlie's cattleya divisions recently. Most want to know exactly how Charlie divides and repots. If you are dividing or repotting your cattleya, you can use different bark, rock, and additives—this is just what Charlie uses.

Part 1—Materials Charlie uses: 3 parts Orchiata, 2 parts hydroton clay pellets, and 1 part #4 perlite mixed together, as shown in the bucket below. You can see the pellets, bark and perlite mixed. You might want to get some peanuts that don't melt, as well, to use in the bottom of the pot for airflow.

He also has his sterilized cutting tool ready, as well as an appropriate sized plastic pot, a hanger, cinnamon, twist ties and a blow torch to sterilize his tools and make holes in the pots where needed. It's okay if you don't want to use a blow torch but then you will need to find some other way to sterilize and stabilize.



Part 2— In order BELOW

1. He soaks the cattleya in a 5 gal. bucket of water with a tablespoon of 20/20/20 fertilizer. He submerges the plant in the water for 4-5 hours. 2. When he takes it out, it easily releases from the pot.

You will see the old peanuts that were originally <u>put in</u> <u>the bottom of the pots to</u> <u>take up room and offer more</u> <u>air flow.</u>

At this point you will be able to feel which roots are dead because they will be mushy. Loosen all the old medium cleaning it off the roots. Feel free to use a hose.

BELOW—3. After cutting off dead roots and parts, he sprinkles those areas with cinnamon. Then he puts a layer of peanuts in the bottom of the pot. 4. After applying a thin layer of medium mixture from the previous page, he sprinkles in some oyster shell. 5. Then he gently places the plant's roots in the pot and pours more medium mixture all around the roots to the top of the pot. 6. A gentle tapping on a hard surface will disperse the medium evenly. #5

AT LEFT: 7. Lastly, he stabilizes the plant by tying it to either the hanger or something that provides stability while the plant starts to grow. Seems like a lot, doesn't it? But once you have all the supplies and are prepared, it's as easy as loading a dishwasher and it provides a ZEN moment. Any questions? Ask Charlie (or if you're desperate, ask Patti)
